Today's Gospel Reflection

Among the evangelists, it is Luke who puts great emphasis on the bodily reality of the resurrection of Jesus and the continuity between the historical Jesus who was crucified and the risen Lord who appears to his disciples. This tells us something important - *that matter and spirit are now eternally united*. This is our own future too, which we profess in the Apostle's Creed: "*I believe…in the resurrection of the body…*" The dichotomy that prioritizes spirit over *matter* and placed greater importance on the *immaterial soul* than the *material body* is called to question by the Gospel's portrayal of the risen Christ. The bodily resurrection of Jesus is also St Paul's argument against those in Corinth (1 Corinthians 6) who think that what is done to the body has no moral relevance since the body will be destroyed in death. But the body has its inherent dignity because it will be raised up and divinized. In fact, it is not only the human body that must be treated with dignity but every created reality on earth – animals, plants, mountains, waters – for Christ's saving work is cosmic in scope, and his resurrection encompasses the whole created order.

Lord Jesus, may we fittingly celebrate your resurrection by treating every reality – human and nonhuman – with respect. Amen.
