Today's Gospel Reflection

God acts concretely within human history. For this reason, the inauguration of God's Kingdom on earth cannot be separated from the choice of Israel as the people through whom God would bring salvation to all. Despite Israel's repeated unfaithfulness, God remains faithful, sending his Son to be born into this nation. Jesus is a Jew, and he deliberately chooses twelve Jewish disciples to represent the twelve tribes of Israel. His instruction to avoid pagan territory should not be misinterpreted as exclusivism. Rather, it echoes the principle behind the saying, "Charity begins at home." Jesus prioritizes the renewal of his own people, awakening them to their God-given vocation to be a "light to the nations." In the same way today, we are called to rekindle the faith of those already baptized so that, as a renewed Church, we may bear more compelling witness to the Gospel in the world.

Lord Jesus, awaken in us a deep sense of responsibility for our brothers and sisters who feel alienated and distant from the faith. Make us instruments of your care and compassion, that through us they may experience your abiding love. Amen.
